- Thousands of students have been exposed to literacy through the distribution of 2,000+ free comics and hosting of 7 literacy lounges and pop-ups; and the project secured ARPA funding from Cuyahoga County to help create an LLC to sustain the work ... Comics at the Corner (2023)
- 60+ blocks of Cleveland neighborhoods were beautified with 600 flowers and 500 bags of mulch, and 250 students and teachers participated in 7 litter reduction courses in partnership with 18 schools and organizations ... Clean and Beautiful Neighborhoods (2023)
- Hundreds of students are addressing stress, gaining DJ skills, and finding opportunities to use those skills
 publicly through a project that later took first place at SEA Change NEO competition and used that prize
 to purchase more equipment ... Soundbender Institute (2023)
- A pilot program with Cuyahoga County Public Library is helping community members learn the fundamentals of social entrepreneurship and use those lessons to make an impact ... Impact Academy (2023)
- 40 consignors are able to provide clean, usable goods to families and children in hospitals and at social service agencies ... Making the Complainable Sustainable (2023)
- More than 1,000 individuals have learned to move mindfully forward in the presence of anxiety by participating in beekeeping ... Bee Brave (2022)
- A new pipeline is helping BIPOC and first-generation college students enter the field of education through a partnership with Cleveland Metropolitan School District and John Carroll University that addresses the low percentage of BIPOC K-12 teachers ... Read Like Me (2021)
- 3,000+ Coping Boxes are exposing youth and their families to healthy coping mechanisms in the face of anxiety, anger, stress, and other emotions; partnerships with 37 hospitals, schools, churches, and rehab centers are addressing mental health; and a curriculum was developed reaching 500+ youth and 300+ teachers ... - 3,500 youth in 7 Cleveland school districts and beyond have gained new life skills, and 50,000 neckties were donated for young men as part of their youth mentorship program ... 1,000 Ties (2020)



- 1,000+ stories of inspiration and hope have been shared to bear witness, build community, and honor resilience, and a book was published to further help people connect, feel hope, and become inspired ... Never, Ever Give Up (2019)
- More than 50 youth have launched or expanded businesses to sell products and services they create ...

- 6,000+ families with pre-school age children were provided simple tools to learn literacy, numeracy, and other skills that would help them become kindergarten-ready ... KinderKits (2016)
- More than 5,000 readers and writers per year attend 200+ literary programs offered by Lit Cleveland to develop writers, amplify voices, and transform our community through storytelling ... A Celebration of Words (2015)
- More than 160 people have received training for lucrative careers through Cleveland Codes Software Developers Academy at Tri-C ... Cleveland Codes (2015)

Also

- Since 2019, 50% or more of presenters have been BIPOC; this year it's 61%.
- Most years since 2017, at least half the finalists have been BIPOC (last year, all 6 categories + Technovation had BIPOC presenters).
- We have had 8 BIPOC overall and/or Technovation winners since 2015.
- Accelerate presenters who met at the competition have collaborated on projects. For example:
 - Allison Lukacsy-Love (2018 Give Box CLE, aka Little Free Pantries) and Stephanie Bude (2017 Kids of the 2016 program to teach trades to youth) partnered to build five of the pantries.
 - Eli Auerbach (2021 "Lifting Kids Up") and Diane Mastnardo (2019 BAAM!) pitched together in 2022 ("Healthy Communities Collaborative")
- Many presenters have pitched and won at SEA Change Ohio and other pitch competitions.
- 12 presenters set up fundraising pages on the iboy crowd-funding platform (ioby.org/campaign/cleveland) and raised thousands of dollars.
